Ethiopia is the second most populous country of Africa, landlocked, but located near the busy trade corridor of the Gulf of Aden. The Ethiopian logistics sector is rapidly developing and offers various opportunities for foreign companies to participate.

The government of Ethiopia is determined to become a Middle Income Country, and transition from an agricultural to an industrial economy. One of the macroeconomic goals is to increase the contribution of the manufacturing industry to the GDP from 6.8 to 17.2%.

Logistics are key to achieve these goals and the sector therefore needs to develop rapidly; Ethiopia has the ambition to move to number 40 of the World Bank's Logistics Performance Index (currently 126). The Ministry of Transport and Logistics (MoTL) will therefore:

- Expand transport infrastructure and improve management
- Increase the effectiveness of integrated transport and logistics services
- Increase uptake of safe transport services
- Engage in institutional implementation and enforce capacity building.





Business Opportunities

The MoTL is opening up the logistics sector and now allows (international) companies to tap into Ethiopian opportunities. The MoTL identified over 40 opportunities, ranging from rail and road infrastructure projects, to (dry) port developments and transport services. A short selection of opportunities are described below:

(Multi modal) freight forwarding

When partnering with an Ethiopian service provider, international companies are invited to create modern and technically efficient freight forwarding and shipping services. These Joint Ventures can also apply for the multimodal cross-border licenses, a right currently reserved only for government-owned ESLSE.

Freight carrying services

Ethiopia wants to increase the number of freight vehicles from 14,000 to 22,000 in 2030 and is looking for investors to accommodate this growth.

Cold chain technologies

Ethiopia currently does not have a streamlined cold chain for perishable goods like fruits, vegetables and pharmaceuticals. International companies can provide knowledge, technology, and equipment for central and decentralized cold storage facilities, including reefer container services.

Warehousing and terminal operations

Dry ports throughout the country are mushrooming. These terminals need investments and operators to provide efficient services. This also requires well-operating warehouses with integrated cool chain technologies.

Last-mile distribution solutions

Companies are invited to establish and implement last-mile logistics to complement rail and road transport.

Packaging manufacturing/importing

Ethiopia is lacking high quality packaging material for various products. Foreign business could fill this gap by manufacturing or importing packaging materials.

Urban and cross-country passenger transport services

Foreign companies are invited to improve transport services throughout the country, both in as in-between the major cities in Ethiopia. This presents investment opportunities for public transport and related services.
